#### December 21, 2016

- **OPENING:** Chairman, Dr. Schaible opened this regular meeting and announced that the Sunshine laws have been satisfied for the convening of this meeting.
- PRESENT: Dr. Schaible, Messrs. Burton, Cichone, Ms. Rohrbach and Dr. Westfield members, Mrs. Plesnarski administrator. Mr. Monaco did not attend.
- APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion to approve the minutes from the regular meeting of November 22, 2016 as written, was carried with roll call of ayes all, nays none.
- APPROVAL OF INVOICES: Motion to approve invoices for December in the amount of \$96,955.95 along with authorization for the Administrator to transfer this amount into the Operating Checking account on January 3, 2017 was made by Mr. Burton, seconded by Ms. Rohrbach. By same motion made by Mr. Burton approval of (1) invoice in the amount of \$3,876.00 to be paid from the General Fund also on January 3, 2017, seconded by Ms. Rohrbach, and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.
- APPROVAL OF BUDGET STATEMENT: Motion to acknowledge the review and approve the December Budget Statement without any exceptions noted as written was made by Mr. Burton, seconded by Ms. Rohrbach and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.
- NEW BUSINESS: Approval of Corrective Action Plan In the course of the 2015 Audit Mr. Colantano, Authority auditor had noted deficiencies that needed to be addressed. Mrs. Plesnarski noted that the Authority implemented additional compensating controls to address the lack of segregation of duties and additional procedures to assure proper bidding procedures are followed. Motion to approve the Corrective Action Plan was

made by Mr. Cichone, seconded by Mr. Burton and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.

2017 Budget Adoption — The 2017 budget as prepared by William M. Colantano, Jr., CPA, PSA, RMA and approved by the board during the October regular meeting was returned approved by the Division of Local Government Services. Motion to **Adopt** the 2017 Budget was made by Mr. Burton, seconded by Dr. Westfield and carried with roll call of ayes all, nays none.

NJ Cash Mgt Capital Improvement Fund – Dr. Schaible noted that the transfer is designed to build up the Capital Improvement Fund. Resolution to transfer \$250,000 from the 2016 Capital Acquisitions line item #3300 monies held in the General Fund to the NJ Cash Mgt Capital Improvement Fund was motioned for approval by Ms. Rohrbach, seconded by Mr. Burton and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.

QuickChek Easement Request – No action was taken on the QuickChek request. Motion to not take action at this time was made by Mr. Cichone, seconded by Mr. Burton and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.

Process Water Pumps Update – Mrs. Plesnarski advised the board that the cost for the process water pumps projected has increased over the original \$18,000 for engineering design and \$80,000 for the pumps and installation. R3m engineering costs will be for an additional \$8,000.00. The scope of the project has been modified. Separation of controllers from pumps was requested as the Authority has experienced controller failure prior to pump failure, and redesign of conduit will be encompassed in the revised bid spec. Equipment cost and installation with the new pump configuration will increase to \$130,000. Dr. Schaible agreed with the changes but wanted to make sure that Mr. Ponte and R3m Engineering realize that their costs need to be overseen. Mrs. Plesnarski noted that the replacement pumps will be designed to accommodate future needs for phosphorous removal. Members were in agreement to the change in scope and additional costs for the project.

ADJOURNMENT: As there was no further business to come before the Board, meeting was adjourned by motion made by Mr. Cichone seconded by Dr. Westfield and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.
