- **OPENING:** Dr. Schaible, Chairman opened this regular meeting and announced that the Sunshine laws have been satisfied for the convening of this meeting.
- **PRESENT**: Dr. Schaible, Messrs. Burton, Villa, and Cichone members, Mrs. Plesnarski, Administrator. Mr. Heller and Mr. Mueller did not attend.
- APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion to approve the minutes from the re-org and regular meetings of February 22,2023 as written, was carried with roll call of ayes all, nays none.
- APPROVAL OF INVOICES: Motion to approve the invoices for the month of March in the amount of \$ 187,737.99 along with the authorization for the Administrator to transfer this amount into the Operating Checking account on April 3, 2023, and approval of (1) invoice totaling \$ 8,997.00 to be paid from the General Fund also on April 3, 2023 was made by Mr. Burton seconded by Mr. Cichone and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.
- APPROVAL OF BUDGET STATEMENT: Motion to acknowledge the review and approve the March Budget Statement without any exceptions noted as written was made by Mr. Cichone seconded by Mr. Burton and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.
- **NEW BUSINESS:** Electronics Recycling Mrs. Plesnarski updated members on the EJIF inspection. It was advised that unused consumer electronics are a hazardous waste. Should there be a fire, they would create toxic fumes. The electronics that were taken out of service were brought to Hunterdon County's Electronic Waste quarterly held Recycling Event after all hard drives were removed and destroyed. Motion to approve the recycling of out of

service consumer electronics was made by Mr. Burton, seconded by Mr. Cichone, and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.

Influent Pump – Mrs. Plesnarski informed the board that one of the two influent pumps was down. The impeller detached from the shaft and the shaft may also be damaged. As we are going into the rainy season a replacement pump and possibly another assembly are imperative as there is no back up pump. Depending on the lead time for a new pump or repair she would consider the rental of a bypass pump. Board members agreed that the replacement pump was essential.

ADJOURNMENT: As there was no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned by motion made by Mr. Burton seconded by Mr. Villa and carried with a roll call of ayes all, nays none.
